School Safety



Unfortunately, the concern around school safety has hit home for Montabella. Threats have been reported to a number of schools around the state and country over the past couple of months. This increase in the number of threats and the recent events in Oxford, Michigan has created an unsettling feeling for everyone.

Our goal is to try and keep our students and staff as safe as possible. In order to accomplish this Montabella has increased some of our security measures over the past couple of years. Here is a list of the current safety measures that are at the school.

- Security film on windows of classrooms that make it difficult for someone outside to see inside the classrooms.
- Security film at the entrances that make the glass more difficult to shatter and gain access to the building.
- Classroom door locks that are thumb turn so no key is needed to lock doors, allowing for a quick security of the room.
- Classroom lockdown devices for all classrooms that add a second layer of security beyond the door locks.
- Secure vestibules at all main entrances that force visitors to enter through the office prior to having access to the building (during school hours).
- Secondary exits were added to classrooms at the elementary which allows a way to get out of a room if the main entrance becomes breached or unavailable. Almost all classrooms within the facility now have this feature.
- Upgraded public address system that goes through the entire complex so that notification can be made with the entire district at once.

In addition to these features that are already in place we are having conversations about the addition of a school resource officer and other building enhancements that might help to keep our schools as secure as possible. We take the task of keeping your kids safe very seriously.



Positive Behavior Interventions & Supports

In order to understand how PBIS came about at Montabella we must first look at the main framework that PBIS is built from, which is MTSS (Multi-Tiered System of Support) . A couple of years ago Montabella adopted the MTSS system that uses data to support every student as a whole (think academically, behaviorally, etc...). Not all students struggle the same, some may struggle with behavior, some may struggle with academics, and some may struggle with both. We have built a district team, as well as secondary teams, that continuously look at multiple forms of data to support our students at Montabella. To ensure that we continue to move forward, each team has set goals to ensure fidelity. Unfortunately, Covid did slow us down, but this year we have made great gains as we continue to implement the processes while being mindful that consistency, adaptability, and positivity are important for success. Earlier this school year, you may remember filling out the School Climate Survey online, we asked our students to fill out a climate survey as well. The data from these surveys is used to help guide our goals as we make decisions on behavior and reading at Montabella. Your voice matters, as well as all of our Mustangs! MTSS is meant to help us recognize students and to offer the appropriate interventions and supports. While MTSS supports both behavior and academics, PBIS is a system of supports that focuses on the behavior aspect.

At Montabella Community Schools we defined Mustang Pride as being **Respectful**, being **Responsible**, and being **Safe**. When we see students exhibiting any of those qualities we try to acknowledge the behavior. The elementary PBIS system includes a paper ticket that the student receives acknowledging their positive behavior. That ticket is then placed into a bin within their classroom. Each week, a student is drawn from every class to pick a prize. All tickets from every class are then poured into a larger school-wide bin. When the school reaches a designated line on the bin they all earn a prize. Their last prize they all agreed on was popcorn and a movie. At the end of the semester there are also names drawn from the big bin for BIG prizes such as: tablets, Big Joe chairs, craft sets, and much more! Students' faces light up when you hand them a PBIS ticket! At the MS/HS building teachers use an app to recognize students. Students earn points and with their points they are able to purchase items from the PBIS store every Friday. There are a lot of prizes to choose from such as: food, Mustang gear, craft supplies, sensory items, sports passes, echo dots, and the famous burrito blanket! The great thing about the app is that students can get on their account and see comments that teachers left them as to why they earned points. Before we introduced the app to the students, staff was using the app to reward points so when students logged in for the first time they were able to see comments left by staff. They were excited and/or shocked to see what positive feedback staff members left for them. We are seeing that this type of positive feedback encourages positive behavior. When we recognize students for representing Mustang Pride it encourages those around them to act in a positive manner.

Starting in January our bus drivers have been honoring one student each week on each bus who are respectful, responsible, and safe. These students are announced by the driver on Friday morning and given a certificate. At the end of the day on Friday the students use the certificate to get a reward from the office. Following our school rules of being respectful, responsible, and safe are equally important on the bus and we are proud to recognize our students who show these qualities.
