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Non-homestead millage is a property tax that applies to **NON-RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES**, like businesses, second homes, or rental properties. This millage helps provide essential funding for local education and services without impacting homeowners. If a non-homestead millage is not passed, our school could face a significant loss in funding, which may result in cuts to educational programs, teacher layoffs, increased class sizes, athletics, and transportation. This does not effect taxes on your primary residence.

The non-homestead millage typically supports a variety of educational programs, including:

- 1. Classroom Instruction Funding for core subjects like math, science, language arts, and social studies, as well as elective courses.
- 2. **Teacher Salaries** Helping to maintain competitive pay for teachers and staff, which is key to attracting and retaining quality educators.
- 3. Special Education Programs Ensuring that students with special needs receive the support and services they require.
- 4. Extracurricular Activities Sports, music, arts, and clubs that enrich students' educational experience beyond the classroom.
- 5. Technology Funding for educational technology like computers, software, and online learning tools.
- 6. School Maintenance and Improvements Ensuring schools have the necessary infrastructure and facilities to provide a safe and modern learning environment.
- 7. School Safety & Security— It helps fund measures to keep students and staff safe, like cameras or other safety infrastructure.
- 8. Support Services—Counselors who play an important role in student well-being, academic support, and career planning.
  - Transportation—Maintain bus routes, pay for fuel, driver salaries, and vehicle maintenance.

By funding these critical areas, the non-homestead millage helps ensure schools continue to offer a well-rounded, high-quality education for all students.

Your Mustang Competitive Cheer Team traveled to Evart High School Tuesday, January 29th in what would be another record breaking competition for Montabella!! The team walked in ready to go and to continue to build on their season! The Mustangs went 3rd in the first round and left the mat with excitement as they felt that it was their best performance to date. The scores showed that it wasn't just a feeling, it was a reality as they scored a season high 200.6 in round 1, an increase of another 8.3 points and second highest in history! The excitement and focus carried into round 2 as the Mustangs took the floor and focused on the littlest of details to help improve their scores, where your Mustangs set a school record round 2 score with a 185.7, which is 20 points higher than the teams previous season high!!
